WORKSHOPS

The Guild arranged for a one-day workshop with Jana Roberts Benzon, in May called "Creature Features".



Jana is a great teacher! The "Creature Feature" workshop taught us to make "Creatures" with raised and formed layers and how to keep the layers apart. These "Creatures" take several curings, which some of us forget we can do with polymer clay. The techniques Jana taught, are great embellishments for pins, pendants and earrings. She also shared many useful hints from her extensive background as a polymer clay artist and teacher.

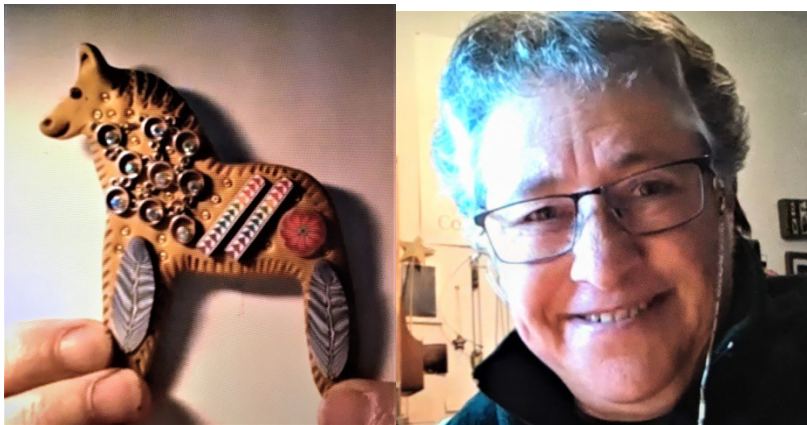


Different clays have different textures, resulting in ease, or difficulty, which can affect the final form. Adding embellishments can make them more interesting.

Bertha also showed how to make image transfers by using color laser copies on regular paper. The trick is getting all the paper off with water or alcohol. Guild members also suggested LaserTran Silk and Magic Transfer Paper as options. Check out The Blue Bottle Tree, for very good information on making transfers.

In May, our first 'member challenge' was to make polymer clay items from cookie cutters.
